

Communication and Language

We will learn new words related to our topic.

We will use different time words when talking about familiar events. We will use descriptive language when talking about different textures and visual characteristics.

We will listen to stories with repeated lines and rhyming words. We will listen and follow instructions.

We will develop our own stories and narrative in our play.

We will engage in role-play activities e.g. in the home-corner, Bear Cave

Expressive Art and Design

We will have the opportunity to play with small world linked to stories.

We will experiment with colour mixing.

We will create light and dark pictures using different media e.g. paint, chalk, pastels etc. We will make differ ent things such as Diva Lamps and lanterns We will learn different songs and rhymes with actions.

Understanding the World

We will learn about seasons and changes.

We will learn about different celebrations—Harvest, Bonfire Night, Diwali, Christmas. We will learn about nocturnal animals, different sources of light, shadows etc. We will look at how light reflects off some materials.

We will use our senses to explore different objects.

Personal Social and Emotional

We will learn to take turns when playing games.

We will work as a team when participating in different activities. We will talk about the morals of different stories.

We will learn to keep our classroom rules.

We will also learn about staying safe in the dark.

We will be learning about the different Autumn celebrations leading up to Christmas such as Harvest and Bonfire Night. We will also learn about different festivals of light such as Diwali.

Mathematics

We sing number rhymes and songs and use our number fingers to help us count. We will count objects and find the corresponding number.

We will order numbers on candles, rockets

We will make number and shape patterns.

We will sequence familiar events in chronological order.

We will sort objects into different groups e.g. light/dark, colours etc.

We will use everyday words associated with time e.g. the days of the week, months of the year, seasons.

Physical Development

We will build dens using different materials.

We will participate in a range of different activities to develop our gross motor skills such as Sticky Kids, Dance and outdo or play.

We will use different resources such as playdough, mark making equipment and scissors to develop our fine motor skills.

Literacy

We will listen and respond to different rhymes and stories such as Owl Babies, The Tiger who Came to Tea, and Elmer. We will talk about our favourite bedtime

We will read non-fiction books together to learn about noctumal animals. We will sequence pictures from different stories and rhymes. We will identify the initial sounds in words e.g. when playing I Spy.

We will begin to learn to read and write simple words, labels and sentences.
