## Outdoor learning


At The Ellis we are working hard to develop the outdoor environment and opportunities to learn outside and in F2 we will be using our outdoor areas as much as possible. This means that your child will need appropriate footwear and coats every day. Most of our children now have wellies in school. If you know that your child does not have any wellies in school could you please send a pair into school as soon as possible, as Autumn is fast approaching and are expecting a change in the weather.

### Reading Books

Reading is a big focus at The Ellis. Home reading books are given to children to share with a member of the family at home. It is very important that you talk about reading books with your child at home. When you share a book with your child please talk about the pictures, what is happening in the story and ask your child what they think might happen next. These activities are as important as reading the words on each page. Please talk to a member of our Foundation Stage Team if you have any questions about reading with your child. Books will initially be changed once a week during the first term. Your child will receive a colour book banded book as well as a Read Write Inc. book linked to their individual phonic level. These will be monitored to ensure they are returned. The books are new and have cost the school a substantial amount of money so we would appreciate your cooperation with this. Thank you.

We will also be introducing reading diaries this term. When you receive your child's diary, please make sure that you write in the diary at least once a week after listening to your children read. Your comments and feedback are an invaluable way of gauging how well your child is developing as an early reader. We will also award regular reading using our reward system in school. Please note that we will replace completed diaries but if lost we ask that a new one is bought from the office at the cost of  $\pounds 1$ .

All children will bring home some High Frequency Words on cards so please help them to practise reading these words by sight as much as possible. We also send home a 'key ring' with four letter sounds each week to practise at home; you will also receive a list of words that you can make with these cards e.g.




### Foundation Phonics - Read Write Inc.

Each child takes part in a daily lesson to develop basic phonic skills in reading and writing. Every week, each child's sight words will be checked and where appropriate, 4 more words will be sent home to learn.

Each child will have letter sounds added to their individual key rings every week. Each child will need to recognise each letter of the alphabet and relate it to the first sound of objects e.g. c at, c ar, c an all begin with 'c'. Please try not to use letter names when working with your child as this can be confusing when they are learning to read words phonetically. Please refer to the parent information booklet that was sent out in July for information about our Read Write Inc. phonic scheme. If you need a paper copy of this booklet then please let us know.

## Topic

Our topic this half term is 'All About Me'. Please see the topic web below for an overview of our learning this half term.



# Home Learning

We will provide a journal to record your child's 'learning journey' through the Foundation stage. It is an opportunity to be part of a home school partnership, becoming involved in your child's education. Every week the staff at school will put something into the learning journey to let you know what your child has been doing in school. In return we ask you to do the same. When you share an activity with your child you can take a photograph or write us a message telling us about it.

Please also remember the list of *Things to do before you're 5*. This is a comprehensive list of key experiences devised by Early Years experts and are important for children as they will enhance their early development and key skills by participating in these activities. ### Parent Partnerships

As an Early Years Team we are eager to forge good working relationships with you as parents as your involvement is so crucial to your child's early development. We are planning to organise an EYFS Library Session once a week and we will be sending you further details about this in the next few weeks. We will also be running our much loved EYFS Coffee Mornings throughout the year, which is a wonderful chance to bring all our children and families together. The children will perform songs and homemade gifts will also be on sale.

### Online Learning

As a school we have subscribed to websites to support the children with their learning. We use Spelling Shed to help the children learn how to spell words. The children will be given their individual logins for Spelling Shed very soon. You will find your child's login details at the front of their reading diaries (these will be sent out in week 3 w/c 12 .9.2022). We will also be providing you with login details for your child for our online Learning Platform SeeSaw. SeeSaw can be used to post photos of home learning and can also be used for remote learning in cases where individual children have to isolate due to Covid. We encourage you to log in to the platform and add some post of things that your children really enjoy doing, this could even be from the list of 50 things to do!

Number Blocks is a fantastic online programme for early Maths development. We use the episodes in school to teach children the relationship between each number. Topmarks Maths is also a fantastic website for the children to be practising all areas of the maths curriculum using interactive games.
