Our half-termly topic

This half-term our topic is 'Where we live'.

We will be looking at a globe and telling our friends all that we know about our world. We will be looking at a map of Great Britain, finding out more about where we live.

We will be talking about The United Kingdom, learning about our King, where he lives and landmarks in London, our currency and our flag.

We will then be telling our friends all about where we live. What street do we live on? What is our house number? What type of house do we live in? (The children might need a bit of help from you to know these details).

We will be talking about how we get to school- do we walk? Drive? Catch a bus? The children will be drawing a map of how they get to school and the things that they see on the way.

We will also be looking at our local environment- Hemingfield. We will look at some photos of Hemingfield such as the school, School Street and the entrance into school, the cross roads, the Chippy, post office and the park. We will tell our friends all that we know about each photo.

Our RE theme is 'Stories'. We will be reading stories such as 'The Hare and the Tortoise', 'the Crocodile and the Priest' and 'Bilal and the Butterfly'.

Our PE sessions will focus on 'Games'. We will be making sure we know how to start and stop without bumping into others. We will then be playing games such as 'aeroplanes' and 'cars' where we have to move like a particular vehicle. We will need to use our best listening ears so we can hear what the teacher is telling us to do!

Our art topic for this half term is 'Sculptures'. Before we begin to make our clay models we will be practicing with playdough. We will talk about the similarities and differences to clay. We will look at some pre-make clay sculptures, talking about what we like or dislike about them. We will talk about how we think the sculptures were made. We will then make our own sculptures from clay.

General Information:

Morning nursery begins at 8:45am. If your child comes to school late and the gates are locked, please take them to the reception office and a member of nursery staff will collect them from there.

The session for part time morning children finishes at 11:45am. Please wait for your child at the nursery gates and a member of staff will send them out to you as soon as they are ready.

Full time children will need a healthy packed lunch (please do not send food with any nut

content and grapes and large blueberries will need to be cut in half). This term we will also be offering a cooked dinner to full time nursery children. Please order and pay for your child's food via Parentpay.

Afternoon nursery session begins at 12:30pm – 3:30pm. These children will need to have eaten their lunch at home before the session begins. Please wait at the red school gate (enter from School Street) and a member of staff will collect your child from there.

Nursery finishes at 3:30pm. Please wait at the nursery gates and a member of staff will send your child out to you. Parents can pick their nursery child up earlier if their siblings are in a class with an earlier finish time (please let staff know if you need to do this).

Please send your child with water in a labelled bottle for them to access throughout the day. It will be sent home each day to be cleaned and returned the next day.

Nursery library will be held in the school library every 2nd Thursday 8:15am – 8:40am. We hope you can come along, choose a story and read with your child. Children learn so much language from these sessions and reading for pleasure is so important to all of our children. We will email you to remind you of the dates we will be holding these library sessions.

Your child will need a pair of wellies for outdoor playtime. The field can sometimes become quite wet and muddy, yet the children still love to be out there! This will also help keep indoor shoes clean and carpets mud-free!

Please remember, if the weather is cold, children will need appropriate outdoor clothing. Warm coats, hats and gloves are essential as we spend lots of learning time outdoors.

As usual, if anyone different is to pick your child up from Nursery, or you are going to be later than expected, please let a member of staff know, or give the school a ring. Also please could you collect your child promptly at 11:45am or 3:30pm for full time children. Thank you.

How can you help at home?

Ask your child what they have been doing at nursery. Talk to them about what they enjoy doing.

Sing rhymes and songs. Ask them about their favourite songs. Tell them about your favourite songs.

Talk to your child. Ask them questions. Language development is everything at this age!

Read, read, read! Ask questions about the main characters, where the stories are set and what happens in the story.

Count at every opportunity. Show them 'how many' using their fingers.

Encourage them to mark–make every day. Let them draw on the paths using buckets of water and brushes or chalks.

Let them see you writing. Explain what you are writing (give writing a purpose).

Point out letters, numbers and shapes in the environment.

Build up their language through pretend play.

Show them how to use scissors—snipping paper is a good start.

Encourage them to get dressed on their own. Show them how to put tights and socks on.

Show them how to turn their coat sleeves the right way around. Show them how to zip their coat up on their own.

Go on walks. Let them run, climb and balance.

Encourage them to eat a varied diet.

Ensure they know the importance of brushing their teeth twice each day and after meals if possible.
