

Dear F2 Parents and Carers,

We hope you have all had a lovely Christmas and a good start to the New Year. It has been so wonderful to welcome the children back this week, it has been lovely to see how quickly they have settled back into school life. Below is information which we hope will be helpful to you for the first half of the Spring Term.

PE

Our PE day is **Wednesday**. Please send your child to school wearing their PE kit. Long jogging bottoms and hooded tops can be worn over the top to keep the children warm. Or alternatively the usual school uniform can be worn over the top of your child's PE kit.

Reading

Reading is a big focus at The Ellis. Library books are given to children to share with a member of the family at home. It is very important that you talk about reading books with your child at home. When you share a book with your child please talk about the pictures, what is happening in the story and ask your child what they think might happen next. These activities are as important as reading the words on each page. Please talk to a member of our Foundation Stage Team if you have any questions about reading with your child. Our Library Sessions will continue to be every two weeks so please look out for messages on Class Dojo regarding future Library dates. The children will continue to access Read Write Inc. phonic activities and when your child is ready, they will start to take home a Read Write Inc. book linked to their individual phonic level. These will be monitored to ensure they are returned. The books are new and have cost the school a substantial amount of money so we would appreciate your cooperation with this. Thank you.

We will introduce the reading diaries to those children who are ready to read a reading book at home. When you receive your child's diary, please make sure that you write in the diary at least once a week after listening to your children read. Your comments and feedback are an invaluable way of gauging how well your child is developing as an early reader. We will also award regular reading using our reward system in school. Please note that we will replace completed diaries but if lost we ask that a new one is bought from the office at the cost of £1.

Foundation Phonics – Read Write Inc.

Please continue to practise the letters that have already been sent home. We will give you updates each week in your child's home-learning journal.

How can you help at home?

This half term we will be learning about toys today and in the past. An information sheet will be sent out with the homework so that you are aware of the key focus for each week which will help you support your child's learning at home. Please talk to your child as much as you can. Language is everything at this stage of your child's development. Ask your child what they have done each day at school. Encourage your child to talk about their interests etc. Talk about what you are doing each day at home to model how to speak in full sentences.

Could you please help by encouraging your child to hold their pencil or pen correctly when mark making. Encouraging them to draw as much as possible will also help your child to further develop their concentration, imagination and fine motor skills.

Read, read, read! Storytime is so important for developing children's love and reading and extending their vocabulary. Remember to ask your child about the main characters, where the story is set, what happens at the beginning, middle and end of the story.

Also, could you please continue to help your child to use cutlery correctly as this will help them to be more independent when eating their lunch in the dinner hall.

Home Learning

A big thank you for all the wonderful evidence that you have been updating us in your child's home 'learning journey', it is really useful to find out about all the fantastic learning and activities that the children are experiencing outside of school. We will continue to put an update into the learning journey to let you know what your child has been doing in school.

Parent Partnerships

As an Early Years Team we are eager to forge good working relationships with you as parents as your involvement is so crucial to your child's early development. We will be holding our Library Sessions on a Friday morning every fortnight so please join us in our Library Area. We will also be running our Writing Workshop on 20.1.26 so please join us if you can. Please also remember that our next Early Years Coffee Morning will be our Easter themed one in March so we look forward to seeing you there!

Online Learning

Number Blocks is a fantastic online programme for early Maths development. We use the episodes in school to teach children the relationship between each number. Topmarks Maths is also a fantastic website for the children to be practising all areas of the maths curriculum using interactive games.
